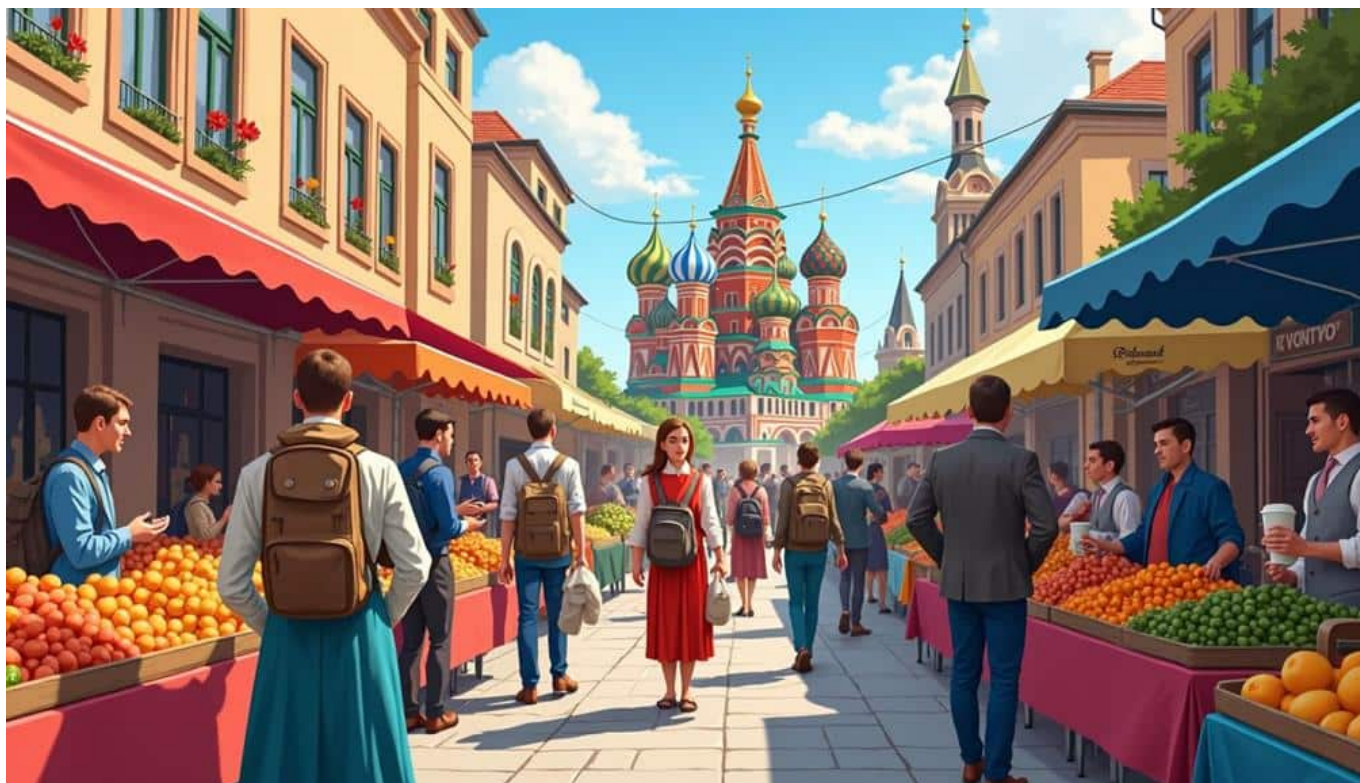
For direction navigation, use "Как мне дойти до...? (Kak mne doyti do...?)" which translates to "How to get to...?"
